Did you know: Hispanic workers only held 5 percent of executive level jobs in the United States in 2021? In addition, a study by the Latino Corporate Directors Association shows that Latinos represent only 2.3 percent of board members from companies listed on the Russell 3000 Index.

In recent years the Hispanic/Latino community has grown immensely. According to the article "Closing the Gap" by Theresa Agovino, she states the "Hispanic workers in the labor force grew to 29 million in 2020 from 10.7 million in 1990. And is projected to reach 36 million in 2030."
